Objectives of Latin-american Credit Reference (CLAR)

- ✓ ***Encourage the development of a curriculum reform***
- ✓ **Estimate the credit as a factor in promoting quality education processes**
- ✓ ***Promote student mobility***

The CLAR's proposal puts into relevance:

- the time of the student
- The work volume required to achieve certain competencies
- the distribution of the amount of work required to achieve certain competencies and realistic learning activities in the curriculum to avoid unnecessary prolongations

New Degree Profiles for New Societies

21 November 2012

- The credits are awarded after successfully completed learning
- Represent a form of recognition of achieved learning outcomes (currency exchange).
- Allow the transfer of student between of different programs and/or institutions inside and outside the national context
- Facilitate labor market recognition of the level of training of the applicant
- Promote learning throughout all life and greater flexibility to the system of Higher Education
- No conflict with national laws
- The CLAR system respects the local, regional, national and institutional autonomy
