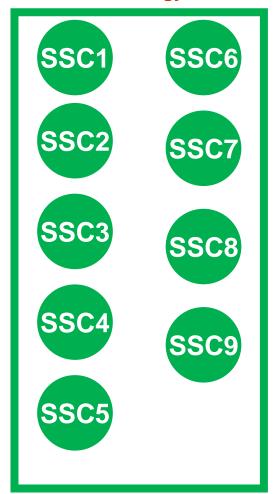

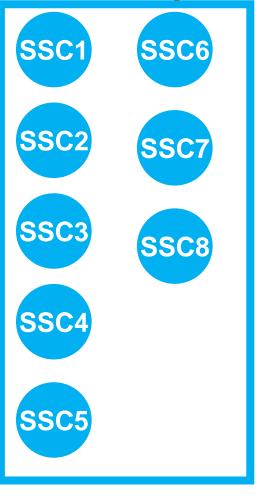
List of Subject Specific Competences for Economics
